Lockdown Lessons — We would like to thank parents/carers for the hard work you are putting in to ensure your children are still learning throughout lockdown. The children are producing some lovely work at home.

The Government expectation is different to the previous lockdown and it is expected that 3-4 hours of work should be set and completed each day.

We would encourage parents to stay in touch with the class teacher at least once a week so that we can monitor progress and also help with any difficulties.

We are starting live group sessions on 'Teams' and you will be sent a username and password shortly if you haven't already received one. This has been trialled with Year 6 and has been a success.

Operation Encompass

The school has been given the opportunity to take part in a project that will run jointly between schools and Staffordshire Police.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced, any domestic abuse.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school staff, (Designated Safeguarding Lead) known as a Key Adult, is



trained to allow them to liaise with the police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have experienced a domestic abuse incident.
