



Sports Premium Report- 2023-24/2024-25

Landau Forte Academy Greenacres appreciates the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of its children. We also acknowledge that a broad, balanced, high quality curriculum and extra-curricular activities have a positive impact on concentration, behaviour, attitude and achievement.

We are committed to ensuring that all pupils receive well-structured PE lessons each week, delivered by well trained and enthusiastic teaching staff. The sports premium funding allows us to further develop and broaden our PE curriculum whilst also continuing to enable our children to make maximum progress. The funding has also allowed us to develop teacher confidence in teaching a varied PE curriculum, resulting in consistently high quality lessons being taught.

For the **2023-24** academic year, Landau Forte Academy Greenacres received a Sports Premium funding grant of **£19,210**.

This report will outline our key achievements from the previous academic year, highlighting the impact of our actions and the budget which was allocated to each key action. It will also include our action plan for the next academic year, highlighting our key focuses whilst also focusing on how previous achievements can be sustained and built upon.

Last year we increased the top-up swimming for all years in KS2 for a term to develop water confidence.
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke, and breaststroke]?	45%	
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort are able to perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	23%
